Nagano Prefecture New Dining Guidelines

When you have meals together, keep in mind the following and support restaurants in Nagano.

Points for talks during meals: Avoid spreading droplets; stay out of range of droplets.

- 1. Use partitions when eating.
- 2. Maintain a distance of more than 1 meter with others. Avoid facing others.
- 3. If 1 and 2 cannot be maintained, wear masks or keep silent while eating.

Preventing Bicycle Theft

After the beginning of a new semester or job, you may have more chances to ride a bicycle. Do you lock your bike?

823 bicycle theft cases occurred in 2020 in Nagano Prefecture, of which 589 (72%) were unlocked.

To prevent robbery,

- Make sure to lock your bicycle on your premises.
- When you leave your bicycle even for short times, use a wire lock too.
- Park your bicycle in a lot with security cameras installed.





Bicycle theft prevention registration is mandatory by law.

When you purchase new one, be sure to register.

The coming season of heavy rainfall causes the risk of sediment disasters. We encourage you to use hazard maps from your municipal office, and to know the location of your evacuation shelter and evacuation routes.

Safety tips is a multilingual application that provides earthquake early warnings, tsunami warnings, weather warnings, and evacuation advice for international visitors to Japan. It also offers disaster-focused communication cards to help facilitate conversation with those around you, and a list of links to resources relevant during natural disasters.
